

What's the Difference Between a Third Nipple and Skin Cancer?

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Pop It!

More than a year ago, I discovered a dark discoloring with some structure to it on my torso's left side. I hadn't noticed it before, but I had somewhat researched third nipples, and I thought it was perfectly harmless. It had the same color as my nipples and what might be a minuscule nipple protruding.

The way I looked at it at first was probably incorrect, but I'll describe the full process of how I looked at it from the beginning, including a mistaken notion on why it changed color.

My first thought was, I recently started using anti-bacterial soap. I had stayed in a hospital with poor hygiene: they washed the wash cloths in the same washing machine as the sheets that patients had smeared poop all over. I thought this might be the cause for some of my other problems, by infecting me with e. coli.

In hindsight, one of those problems, the discoloring under my armpit, seems to be stress related psoriasis, which under armpits doesn't typically have flakes, which is why I didn't recognize it. It doesn't even itch. I'm working on lowering my stress levels and that's the right solution, not what I started doing at first.

After I started washing with anti-bacterial soap, what I believed was the third nipple started changing color. It got pale. That made me reconsider. I figured it might be skin cancer and at first I thought the anti-bacterial soap might have killed the T-cells, allowing it to grow. That's impossible, because it would have to get into the blood.

Continuing to describe what I saw visually, the discoloring and the structure had been there for a long time and it never changed shape or color before. Now on the outsides it got pale and the dark color disappeared. I couldn't see yet what it was, but it had the same color as a blister, without the skin having the dull kind of look to it that blisters often have. It didn't have pus to it.

This was the 20th of June.

Since it changed color and that's one of the things you see with skin cancer, I was alarmed, but not frightened. If you want to kill cancer, all you have to do is get some T-cells in there, so I figured I pop it with my nails to the extent that it bleeds, which I did, and the discoloring turned out to consist of a clear slightly yellowish fluid.

I didn't wash it, because I didn't want to remove T-cells, but did put a bandaid on there.

The morning of the 21st of June, I got under the shower and I could easily scrub off the remains of what before was a darker patch of structured skin of which very little was now left. Now I believe that my body was already attacking whatever it was and it would have fallen off even if I hadn't popped it.

I don't have doctors I can work with. When you flash them your penis, they hand you medication you don't really need, so I'm left with myself to figure things out. Either way, it now looks like a nice and clean wound that will have healed properly in a couple of days.
